

That's where YOU come in. Thanks to you, our youth are getting the help they need to build a life for themselves.


Just recently I heard from a young person who is so thankful for your support. He is a part of our new Direct Cash Transfer Pilot Program.

The victim of verbal abuse, Avery was feeling isolated and unsure of where to go. Thankfully, through their school's partnership with Spectrum, Avery learned about the programs available and how they could receive help.

## A Day at the Drop-In Center - Thanks to YOU

We hear stories daily from youth who have found hope and happiness because of your support. But we can't always share them. More than anything we want you to know how youth are impacted by your generosity.

So, here's an example of one teen's experience:

On a cold morning, I stood outside the door to the Burlington Drop-In Center waiting for it to open. I had spent the night sleeping in my tent at the park, and I couldn't wait to go inside.

> When the doors opened, I was greeted by smiling faces. I was nervous because I hadn't been there before.

But I had heard from a friend that I'd be safe at the Drop-In Center.

I grabbed a bite to eat and found a place to sit. It wasn't long before someone quietly joined me. I was hesitant at first, but they seemed nice.

I learned that I could stay until the doors closed at 5:45pm. There was a simple intake form that I could fill out when I was ready,

but there was no pressure.

For now, I could just relax and decompress. Honestly, I was just thankful to have a safe and warm place to be.

Later, I took a hot shower, did my laundry, and took a nap. Before long, some of the other people were in the kitchen baking cookies together.

When the smell of chocolate chip cookies filled the room, I wandered over to grab one. It was in this moment that I realized it was the first time I truly felt safe in months.

I spent the better part of the day just observing and listening. My friend was right—the Drop-In Center really did feel safe, without judgment, and like I could get the support I needed to build for myself the future I longed for.

Thank you for providing youth a safe and judgment-free place to go. Your generosity helps keep the Drop-In Center doors open 7 days a week so youth can get the care they need.
