Eli stood outside Spectrum's Drop-In Center, pacing back and forth. He was debating whether to walk in or go buy alcohol.

"If I stayed sober, I could have a place to stay," Eli said. "If I didn't, I had nowhere to go."

For most of his life, Eli bounced from place to place. "I've never

really had a permanent spot," he said. "It's always been here, there, everywhere." Over time, that instability took its toll, and substance use became a way to cope.

One day, Eli walked through the doors and asked to talk to someone. Thanks to your support, our doors were open and caring

"Thank you to anyone who has devoted their time to giving young adults like me a place to call home, even for just a short while.


"God bless you all and happy new year."

After years of moving among shelters, Tyler finally found a place he could trust—and a home of his own

For years, Tyler moved from one shelter to another, sometimes crashing on friends' couches before being asked to leave when things got hard. By the time he found Spectrum, he wasn't sure this place would be any different.

At first, it wasn't easy. He told staff he hated it here. He hated the rules, the structure, the curfew.

But staff kept showing up. They stayed consistent when things got messy. And slowly, something shifted.

Tyler began asking for help before conflicts escalated. He started setting goals. After many setbacks and second chances, he finally moved into an apartment of his own.

One evening, Tyler stopped by to vent about his new couch—how stressful it had been getting it through the door and positioned just right. Staff laughed with him and celebrated that this was the kind of problem he now had to solve.

Before leaving, he grabbed a Spectrum magnet for his fridge.

"Yeah," Tyler said. "I'll represent you guys."

SAFETY AND SECURITY FOR YOUTH IN NEED

Your Gift Helped Sofia Move From Survival to Stability

Thanks to you, Sofia has a safe place to call home and a future she can plan for

For most of her life, Sofia was in survival mode. She spent years sleeping in temporary places, never knowing how long she could stay. Even when she was working, one unexpected expense could undo everything.

When Sofia connected with Spectrum, she wanted what many young people want but that she never truly had: stability. A place to feel safe. The ability to plan beyond the next day.

Thanks to your support, Sofia was selected to receive direct financial support through Spectrum's Direct Cash Transfer pilot program—providing steady income for 18 months to help young people experiencing homelessness work toward housing, jobs, and long-term stability.

For the first time, Sofia could pay her bills without constant fear of falling behind. She replaced a stolen bike, earned her driver's license, and even saved money for the very first time.

Those early steps made it possible for Sofia to move out of shelter housing and into an

apartment with roommates. A year and a half later, she reached a milestone she once thought was out of reach—**signing a lease in her own name.**

“I didn’t feel safe when I was young,” Sofia shared. “Now I finally do.”

Today, Sofia works full-time, pays her rent, and has savings in the bank. Thanks to you, her life finally feels steady enough to look ahead.

That first night was hard. “I couldn’t sleep. I cried most of the night,” Eli said. “I didn’t know what to do.”

But Eli stayed. Over time, the shelter started to feel like home. With your support, he had warm meals, caring people, and a community that believed in him.


Today, Eli is sober. He’s working, attending counseling, and preparing to return to school. He’s also reached a major milestone—securing an apartment of his own.
